#### How Do You Write a Strong Meetup Event Description?

Your event description on a D37 Meetup Hub is like any advertisement. To be successful you need to provide the reader with a What, When, Where and especially a <u>Why</u>. Be sure to catch the eye of a reader with a strong appeal focused on what's in it for them. How can you help them grow? Improve? Succeed? Follow that up with the essentials of where and when your club meets and how to obtain more information. Also, don't let your message grow stale and neglected. Be sure to periodically refresh the Meetup event with new words and ideas.
