ACC Toastmasters Club features a two-hour meeting with enhanced evaluations. In addition to detailed speech evaluations by our experienced evaluators, we have "Round Robin" evaluations, approximately one minute long, from several members for each speaker. Our extended meeting time allows for the longer speech assignments and for (2) to (3) minute Table Topic Speeches as well. Table Topic speeches also receive a Round Robin evaluation. Meetings often include a "Speaker's Tip" presentation from outside experts and ACC members. All these things designed to help our members take it to the "Next Level" as communicators and leaders.

At Blue Moon Advanced Toastmasters, "The Place Champions Call Home," we have cut out some of the other processes that happen at regular Toastmasters Clubs so there is time to deliver longer presentations and evaluations during our 2-hour meeting. We offer in-depth evaluations and round robin evaluations (all members comment on a speech) so you can receive feedback from the most experience toastmasters in North Carolina. Blue Moon has the most DTMs and professional speakers of any club in the state. As a club, Blue Moon does not compete in Toastmasters contests. We offer assistance to contestants and are available to be judges.

- Eat Your Words (2nd Wednesday of the month 6pm-8pm) eywtm.toastmastersclubs.org Expect the unexpected! For those times when you are called on to speak or lead in your workplace or volunteer organization with little notice or in an environment that is not ideal, this club will help you practice IMPROMPTU skills. Meeting roles are randomly assigned. Normally we meet in a variety of restaurants in the Concord area near I85 to practice dealing with unexpected environmental challenges. Open club; no prerequisites—If you are thinking about joining a Toastmasters club, especially one that focuses on IMPROMPTU skills, and ONCE per month meetings (second Wednesdays 6-8 PM) will work best for you—THIS could be your HOME CLUB!

We are a Specialty club focused on helping people to develop humor. Humor is something that not only adds value to a speech but can also improve our health and well-being.

The club originally was formed in memory of D37's Jay Nodine and continues as a tribute to his quote concerning Toastmaster Meetings, He said, "If you are not having fun, then you are not doing it right." Please check out our website for more detail.

• **In Good Company** is an Advanced Toastmasters Club and as such, we do 2 things just a little differently.

For evaluations, we have round-robin evaluations so that you get feedback from more than one person. Over half of our member base are DTMs, so you get very high quality feedback. We start with what we really liked about the presentation. Often members build upon what the previous person said. "Yes, I liked x too, and I thought y made it even better." Our next step is what we call "polishing the diamond" - how you could make that speech even better. Sometimes you'll get contradictory advice. One person may think you should do something differently or even drop a speech element, and another may say that it made the speech for them. Getting feedback from everyone means that one person's bias won't lead you to eliminate a speech feature that the majority DOES like. We wrap up by sharing the one gem we won't forget from your speech, or something new we learned that will stick with us.

We call our table topics "activities", and the role is activities master. Sometimes activities are just like table topics in any other club, but sometimes we stretch the boundaries a bit, adding in a little improv, or building a story as a team, or sometimes everyone at the meeting is involved. You just never know. If you've ever seen "Whose Line is it Anyway?", you'll have the general idea.

Please don't get the idea that only experienced Toastmasters are welcome or benefit from our club. We've had plenty of brand spanking new members, and all you need is a willingness to jump in and give it a try. Our feedback is tailored to where YOU are in your speaking journey.
