
Happy Spring!

Cut 1 thawed **puff pastry** sheet into 6 triangles. Top evenly with 3 Tbsp. **marinara sauce**. 1/2 cup **shredded Italian cheese** blend, and 1/4 cup **pepperoni slices** (optional). Starting with widest end, roll each triangle. Place, tip side down, on a **parchment**-lined pan. Brush with **1 beaten egg** and sprinkle with 1/4 tsp. **oregano**. Bake at 325 degrees F until golden. 40 minutes.
