Benefits of the DTM Award

Personal Growth

Challenges individuals to step outside their comfort zone repeatedly, leading to personal and professional growth

Networking

Connects individuals with Toastmasters from different backgrounds and experiences

Leadership Skills

Prepares individuals for leadership challenges in all aspects of life

Recognition

Garners respect and recognition within the Toastmasters community and in professional and personal circles


Complete Two Learning Paths



Club Officer

- Serve as a Club Officer for two six-month terms or one annual term
- Participate in the preparation of a Club Success Plan
- Participate in District-sponsored Club Officer Training

From Club Central



District Leader

Complete one-year term as a District leader

Appointed Positions

- Area Director
- Finance Manager
- Public Relations Manager
- Administrative Manager

Elected Positions

- Division Director
- Club Growth Director
- Program Quality Director
- District Director

Nominations are now open for 2025-2026 District leadership positions



Option 1: Club Mentor

Serve successfully as a Club Mentor or Club Coach

Club Mentor

- Appointed by District Director or Club Growth Director (max two per club)
- Serve 6 months as a Club Mentor to a new club
 - Attend meetings, provide insights, train officers, grow the club membership
- Term starts after the new club charters
- Term ends after 6 months will approval of Club President




Option 2: Club Coach

Serve successfully as a Club Mentor or Coach

Club Coach Eligibility

- Appointed by the District Director or Club Growth Director (max two per club)
- Club Coach Criteria:
 - Active member of Toastmasters for at least one year
 - Cannot be a current member of the club or a past member within last six months
 - Can only coach one club at a time
 - Completed at least a Pathways Level 2, ACB, or ALB
 - Served as a Club Officer for one year
 - Completed the Club Coach training module
 - May be reappointed at the end of the two-year term for an additional two years



- Club has at least three paid members but not more than 12
- Club must not be suspended or closed
- Club Officers completed Club Coach training module
- Successful Club Coach Criteria:
 - Serve as a Club Coach for at least six months
 - Club achieves Distinguished Club status
 - Optional: Club has at least 20 paid members on their roster to get credit towards District leadership
 - Term ends after two years after achieving the above success criteria and with the approval of the Club




Option 1: Club Sponsor

Serve successfully as a Club Sponsor or Conduct a Youth Leadership program or a Speechcraft

Club Sponsor

- Appointed by the District Director or Club Growth Director (max two per club)
- Help new club lead to reach charter strength (minimum 20 members)
- Assist with completion of application forms
- Participate in initial meetings
- Plan charter ceremony




Option 2: Youth Leadership Program

Serve successfully as a Club Sponsor or Conduct a Youth Leadership program or a Speechcraft

Youth Leadership Program

- Conduct a workshop for eight one-totwo hour sessions for kids between the ages of 14 and 18
- Typically sponsored by a club or a school
- Limited to 25 students
- Meetings resemble a Toastmasters meeting



Option 3: Speechcraft

Serve successfully as a Club Sponsor or Conduct a Youth Leadership program or a Speechcraft

Speechcraft

- Conduct a workshop for eight sessions for participants who are not Toastmasters
- Usually sponsored by a club
- Participants deliver 5 speeches



DTM Project

Create and implement a project of your own design and demonstrate skills and expertise gained

Requirements

- Must complete one Path and Levels 1, 2, and 3 in a second unique Path
- Submit project request to TI
- Create a project that benefits an organization
- Form a team and lead through project completion
- Deliver two speeches
